OSTRÓW LEDNICKI - GREATER POLAND ETHNOGRAPHIC PARK IN DZIEKANOWICE - BISKUPIN

5 SEPTEMBER 2026



Welcome to a one-day journey through the origins of the Polish state. During this excursion, participants will explore Ostrów Lednicki - a site closely associated with the beginnings of the Polish state, the Greater Poland Ethnographic Park in Dziekanowice, where they will discover traditional rural life in Greater Poland and Biskupin - Poland's best-known archaeological reserve. The tour offers an opportunity to explore some of the country's most important archaeological sites and places connected with the beginnings of the Polish state.

ROUTE: Poznań - Ostrów Lednicki - Dziekanowice - Marcinkowo Górne - Biskupin - Poznań

SCHEDULE:

9:00 Departure from Poznań

19:00 Return to Poznań

ITINERARY:

- Departure from Poznań. Transfer to Ostrów Lednicki - one of the most important archaeological sites associated with the origins of the Piast dynasty and the early Polish state. The visit includes a ferry crossing to the island and a guided walk through the remains of the stronghold of Mieszko I and Bolesław the Brave. Participants will see the remains of the ducal palace (palatium), chapel and bridges dating back to the early years of the Polish state. According to many historians, this is one of the possible locations where the baptism of Mieszko I may have taken place.
- Transfer to the Greater Poland Ethnographic Park in Dziekanowice - a picturesque open-air museum presenting traditional village life in Greater Poland. The visit includes historic cottages, windmills, a blacksmith's workshop, a village school and farm buildings dating from the 18th and 19th centuries. Walking through the historic village will provide an insight into the everyday life, customs, culture and traditional crafts of the region.
- Transfer to Marcinkowo Górne. Lunch including potatoes, two types of meat, seasonal salads, cake, coffee and tea.
- Transfer to Biskupin, one of the most valuable archaeological reserves in Poland and Europe. Participants will learn about the famous Lusatian culture settlement dating back more than 2,700 years, walk along the reconstructed wooden streets of the fortified settlement, see reconstructed houses, workshops and defensive structures, and learn about the results of decades of archaeological research conducted at the site. Return to Poznań after the visit.

The itinerary and timing are approximate and may be subject to change due to traffic conditions, organisational requirements or the pace of the tour. This programme is offered as a comprehensive package travel service.
